Abie King, age 60 of Norman, passed away Wednesday, May 23, 2011. Abie Lee Fields was born September 6, 1951 in Drumright, OK, the 4th of 6 children born to Alex Fields & Thelma Marie (Greer) Fields. She spent her early childhood in Drumright, later graduating from Spencer's Dunjee High School in 1970. While in high school, she attended the Foster-Estes VO TECH, where she studied Commercial Art. Abie then attended the Elkins Institute of Broadcasting, and in 1973, became the 1st Black woman in the State of Oklahoma to earn a 1st Class Radio/Telephone Broadcaster License. She worked as an intern for News Channel 9 and during her career, Abie worked for the KFJL-KBYE Radio Stations, as well as several stints with other local radio stations. At one time, Abie even published a newspaper. Abie was a lovely person who greatly enjoyed working with arts & crafts and planting flower gardens. She cherished her family and especially her children, and grandson, Xavier. She will be dearly missed by all who knew her.
