Barbara was known for collecting rocks, and never missed the chance to take a drive and see the beautiful fall foliage every year. She was beloved wife, mother, and grandmother who will be dearly missed. Barbara was preceded in death by her parents Mike and Era Bruno, and her

siblings Francis Lackey, Zona Smith, Bill "Chief" Bruno, Carl Bruno, and Tom Bruno.

She is survived by her husband, Bill Brown of the home. Her daughter Dana Brown and fiancé Shawn Hoover of Wanette, her granddaughter Autumn Brown and boyfriend Gage Crook of Wanette, and great granddaughter GraceLynn Brown.
