He is survived by his devoted wife; his two sons, Bobby Rose Jr. and David Paul Rose; his three grandchildren, David II, Alex, and Amanda; his younger sister, Sue; and his four great-grandchildren, Adela Rose, Lincoln Rose, Julian Stevens, and Sebastian Stevens.

Bobby had a deep love for fishing, wrestling, and stock car racing, and was a devoted Jacksonville Jaguars fan. He also enjoyed racing motocross alongside his sons, while his wife supported them by working the snack bar—memories that reflected the closeness and joy of their family life.

Known as a man who was loved by all, he will be remembered for his strength, loyalty, and the lasting impact he made on his family and friends. He will be deeply missed and forever remembered by all who had the privilege of knowing him.
