Donald Campbell, age 77 of Purcell, passed away Tuesday, April 23, 2019, at the Norman Regional Healthplex. Donald Gene Campbell was born October 8, 1941 in Wynnewood, OK, the oldest of 4 children born to H.E. "Hotshot" and Charlene Campbell.
