Floyd Lemuel Cox, age 67 of Noble, passed away unexpectedly at home, Tuesday, April 15, 2014. He was born June 6, 1946 in Noble, Oklahoma. He was the 5th child of nine children born to Lemuel Cox and Opal Irene (Bentley) Cox. Floyd grew up in the Noble area and attended the Noble schools.
