



## Glen Neal Madden

August 4, 1961 - September 10, 2012

Glen Neal Madden, age 51 of Wayne, passed away Monday, September 10, 2012 at his home. He was born on August 4, 1961 in Purcell, OK. Glen was the 3rd child of nine children born to Jacob Nathaniel Madden and Vernie Mae (Andrews) Madden. Glen grew up a farm boy living in the Payne and Wayne farming communities. On the farm he learned how to work hard raising livestock and hauling hay. Throughout his life he kept this same work ethic of working hard at whatever he did. During his years at Wayne High School he enjoyed being in FFA and showing pigs. After high school he continued farming for various farmers in the McCain County area and he owned and operated a hay hauling business. Some of the farmers he worked for were; Gary Ellis, Tom Garrett, Sid Ellis, Raymond Ellis and Bob Blackwell. From 1984 - 1988 he worked for Thermal Dynamic Systems and for Cail Construction. During this time of his life, he met and married the love of his life, Debra Kay Hackett. They were married on September 27, 1986 in Norman, OK and later made their home in Wayne where they raised twin sons, Brandon and Dillon. In 1990, Glen worked for Willingham Trucking, and then in 1991 he began working for Aztec Building Systems. Glen loved working with his hands and working in construction. He passed these same skills on to his sons who are now pursuing their degrees in construction management at OSU. In 1994 he bought a dozer and started his own construction business. While running his own business he also worked for Hartage Criner Super Fund Site and the Tar Creek Super Fund Site until the

project was completed in 1997. Glen continued operating his dozer business until he went to work for the City of Purcell in 2003. After five years of service to the City of Purcell, and seeing his boys through high school and graduating, Glen then took a job in 2008 with his longtime friend, Bob Blackwell, at Blackwell Enterprises, Inc. Glen loved his sons and enjoyed coaching them in Wayne Little League Baseball from 1996-2003. Throughout their years at Wayne schools he supported them in all of their sporting events and taking them hunting, fishing and noodling. Glen was an active member of the Goldsby Baptist Church.
