Glenn Mowdy age 78 of Lexington, passed away Friday, October 12, 2018 at Integris Baptist Hospital in OKC. Glenn was born on November 16, 1939 in Mowdy, Oklahoma near Coalgate. He was the youngest of five children born to Jim Glenn Mowdy and Susan Ella (Hough) Mowdy.

Growing up a country boy, Glenn learned how to work hard when he was younger and he kept that same work ethic throughout his life. After graduating from Centrahoma High School in 1958, he enlisted into the U. S. Army and proudly served his country for three years, three months and three days.
