Kendall Johney Maynard was born to Johney Burse Maynard & Barbara Anna (Melton) Maynard, in Purcell, OK on January 3, 1936. He stepped into the presence of Jesus on August 21, 2025 at age 89.

Ken grew up in Washington and graduated from Washington High School in 1954. He attended college at Panhandle State University in Goodwell, OK on a basketball scholarship. It was there that he met the love of his life, Mary Dee Webb. Ken and Mary Dee were married on September 1, 1956. They lived in OKC, Durant and Calera before settling in Ken's hometown of Washington, OK. There they raised 4 children, Larry Kendall, Cynthia Gale, Janis Deanne and Barbara Michelle. Ken worked at Fox-Vliet Drug Company in Oklahoma City for several years. He started working at Westinghouse, when it opened in 1972.
