



## Larry Alton Northcutt

May 30, 1945 - June 14, 2025

Larry Alton Northcutt, age 80 of Kingston, Oklahoma, passed away unexpectedly Saturday, June 14, 2025 at Mercy Hospital in Ardmore. He was born May 30, 1945 in Purcell, OK to Alton Hollis Northcutt and Gracie Jo (Page) Northcutt. Larry was raised in Lexington where he attended school, graduating with the Bulldog Class of 1963. By chance, he met a young lady named Helen Delores Kersey at a basketball tournament their senior year in high school. Larry knew she was the one, and he married her on June 16, 1967 in Lexington. They first made their home in Moore. They were both teaching in Oklahoma City at the time, while Larry pursued his post graduate. He joined the Oklahoma National Guard, and served his country proudly. He returned to teaching in Oklahoma City at Star Spencer High School after returning from active duty. After teaching in Oklahoma City a few years, he taught high school math at Prague Public Schools, and later became Principal. An opportunity to be Superintendent at Coyle Public Schools became available and Larry jumped at it. They moved to Coyle where they raised their daughters Alecia and Marcia, and Larry spent the next 23 years serving the district, before retiring in 2001. He served as Interim Superintendent for Kingston Public Schools for a time, before retiring for good. Away from work, Larry enjoyed hunting and fishing. He enjoyed traveling and especially 5th wheeling in the winters where they met many "snowbirds" who became good friends. His true passion was being with family, raising registered Limousine cattle, and life at the farm. Larry was a man of great faith

and longtime member of the Lighthouse Methodist Church in Kingston. He will be dearly missed!

He was preceded in death by: his parents, Alton and Gracie Jo Northcutt and his daughter Alecia Northcutt.

Larry is survived by: his wife Helen of the home; daughter, Marcia Warren and husband Clint of Tuttle; his pride and joy, grandchildren, Jace, Brynli and Jentri; great grandchildren, Langston and Laramie, and a host of other family and friends.
