Margaret Lynn (Kelley) Newville of Oklahoma City went home to be with her Lord and Savior on December 16, 2024, surrounded by her loving family. Born on October 2, 1947, in Sutton, WV, to mother, Mary Ellen Herron, Margaret (lovingly referred to as “Margie”) was a doting and powerfully loving wife and mother to two wonderful sons. She never spoke harshly and showed only love and respect to everyone she knew and met. Being raised predominantly by her loving grandparents, Bill and Pearl Herron of Lexington, OK, she became a graduate of Lexington High School in 1965, after which she married her high school sweetheart, Richard Keith Newville on July 3, 1965, and was married to Richard for nearly 60 years at her passing. Their love story began over 62 years ago when they met in the high school lunchroom, being introduced by Richard’s cousin and classmate. Her major interests in life included sewing and dress making, working at her home church-run clothing boutique, then later in life taking up cross-stitch projects to provide lasting memory gifts to her loved ones on special occasions.
