



## Patsy Ruth Roach-Lozier

Patsy Ruth Roach-Lozier, age 83 of Washington, passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 5, 2025. Born October 22, 1941 in Bristow, Oklahoma, to Purl Gregory and Margaret Ruth (Cunningham) Lozier, she was the oldest of four children. She spent her early years in Okla. She looked forward to her annual Class reunions. Never shy of an opinion, she enjoyed a good Facebook debate and sharing other's life stories. She was a wonderful cook, and will forever be remembered for her chocolate sheet cake. She will be dearly missed!
