Stephen Dean Kennedy, age 76 of Newcastle, passed away Sunday, February 13, 2022. Stephen was born November 13, 1945 in E. St. Louis, IL, the oldest of 6 children born to Robert Dean Kennedy and Alva Charlene (Burton) Kennedy. He was raised primarily in Rolling Meadows, graduating from Arlington Heights High School in 1963. Stephen joined the United States Air Force, and served three tours in Vietnam. He was a true patriot and proud to serve his country, and he retired from the Air Force after more than 22 years of honorable service. Back in the states, Stephen landed at Scott Air Force Base. He began working for the FAA, and eventually relocated to Newcastle. He continued his work with the FAA as a Pilot and an inspector, retiring after a long and distinguished career. Stephen married Becky Jo Klamm on April 13, 1995, on the family farm in Louisburg, KS. Away from work, he was probably in his boat fishing somewhere. He cherished his family and especially Becky and his fur buddy, Tony. Stephen was a kind soul and a true friend, and he will be dearly missed!
