Tommy Dean Clay age 69 of Newcastle, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on Thursday, February 7, 2019 at his home. For several years Tommy fought a battle with cancer. Tommy was born on October 20, 1949 in Oklahoma City, OK. He was a twin and the oldest child of seven children born to Tommy Delbert Clay and Norma Christine (Ladd) Clay. Tommy grew up in South Oklahoma City and attended U. S. Grant High School. At age 19, he was drafted into the U. S.
