W.F. "Dub" Jensen, age 73 of Noble, passed away Tuesday, February 21, 2017, at the Oklahoma Veterans Center in Norman. W.F. Jackson Jensen was born September 16, 1943 in Wallville, Oklahoma, 1 of 6 children born to George Jackson Jensen and Darlis Lillian (Brown) Jensen. He was raised in the Hughes Community and attended Hughes schools, graduating High School in 1961. After school, Dub answered the call for his country, and joined the United States Air Force. He married Phyllis Ann Weatherford on March 7, 1965 at the Hughes Baptist Church. Together they raised 3 children, son, Monte and daughters, Samantha and Trinity.
