W.K. "Noosty" Wallace, age 96 of Rosedale, passed away Thursday, May 17, 2018, at the Norman Regional Hospital. Waldren Kendell Wallace was born December 15, 1921 on the family homestead near Rosedale. He was the 7th of 8 children born to E.L. and Oma Wallace. He was raised in Rosedale and attended school there. In November of 1942, W.K. answered the call of service and joined the United States Army. He served his country with pride, distinction and honor in World War II, serving in both the Central and South Pacific and in Saipan.
